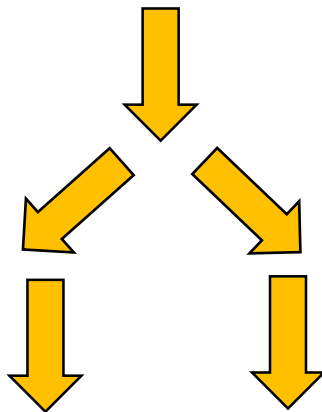
Overview of IQS Committee Work in 2018

 - One actual incident for certification
 - AHIMTA PTBs should be used

- No entity has tested it

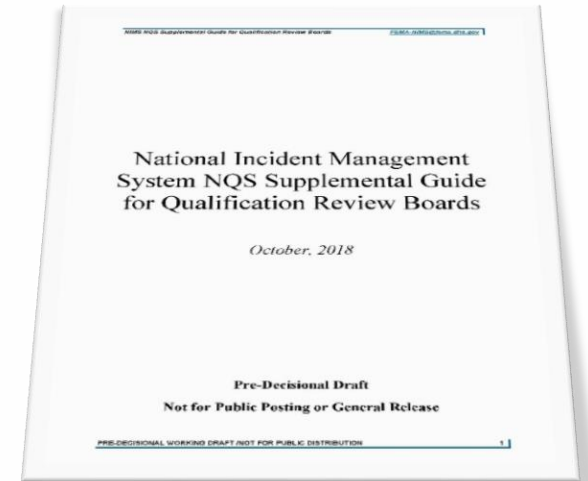


IIMQS
