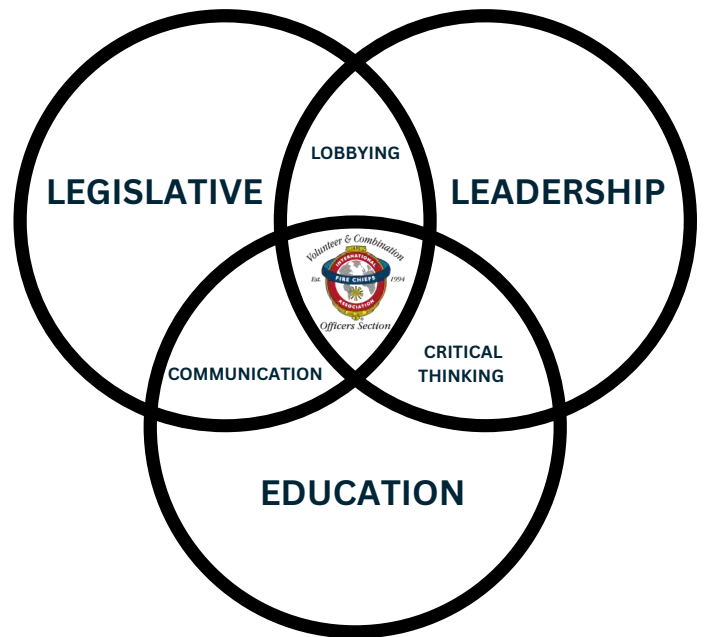


Strategic Initiatives

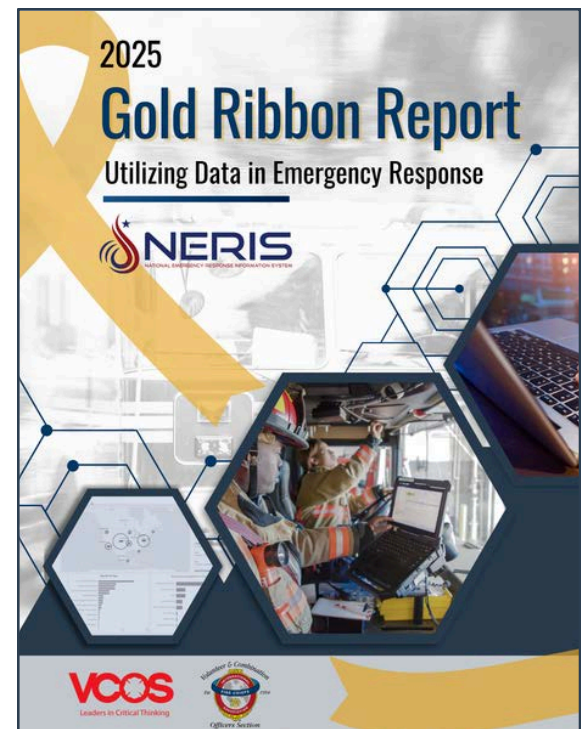
Gold Ribbon Report on Data

The report provides clear guidance, best practices, and practical considerations to help agencies understand and leverage the critical role data plays in today's fire and emergency services environment.

This pivotal document reflects our collective commitment to advancing emergency response capabilities through the strategic, informed use of data. It reinforces the importance of data-driven decision-making and positions our members to meet the evolving demands of modern emergency response.

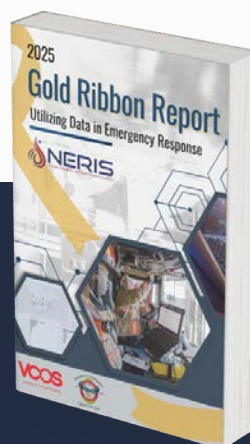
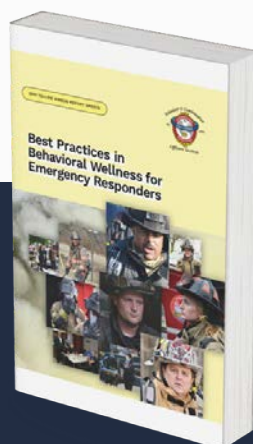
