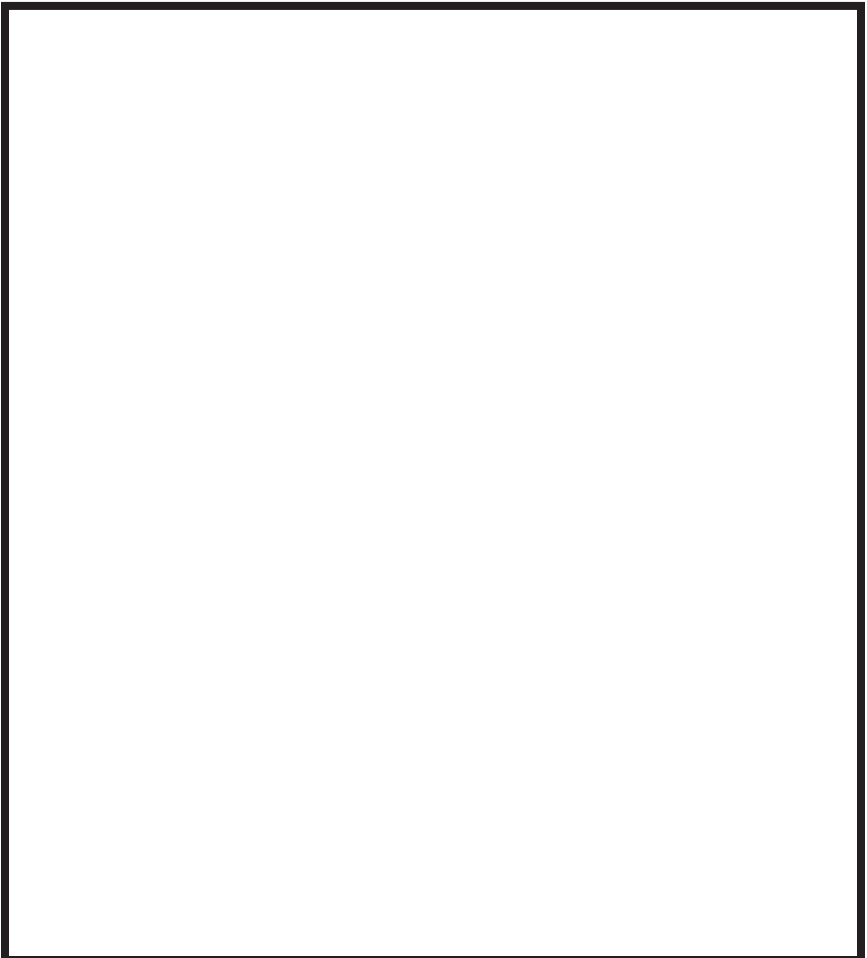

Draw a picture of what the outdoors looks like where you live.

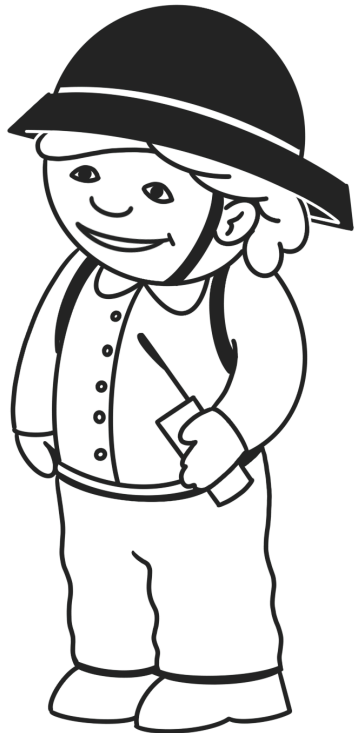


Mission 2: Get to Know Your Firefighter

Mission 3: Be *Ready*

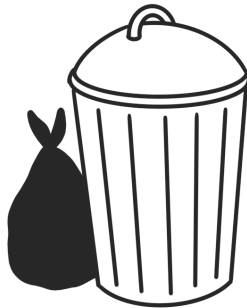
Having a clean yard helps get your home **READY** for a wildland fire. Color the leaves that Alex is helping rake.



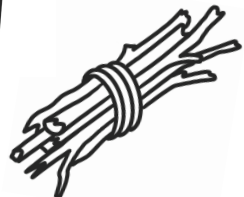

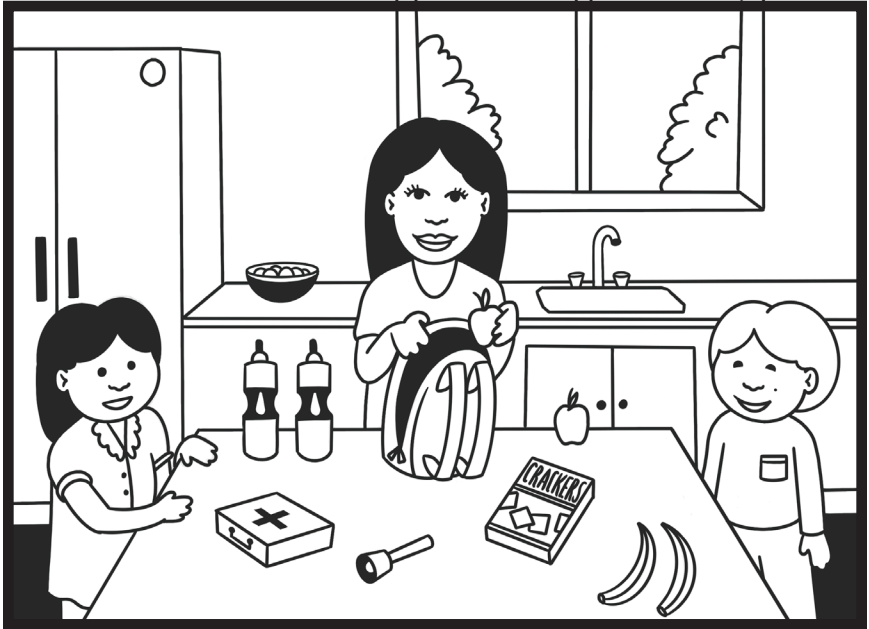
